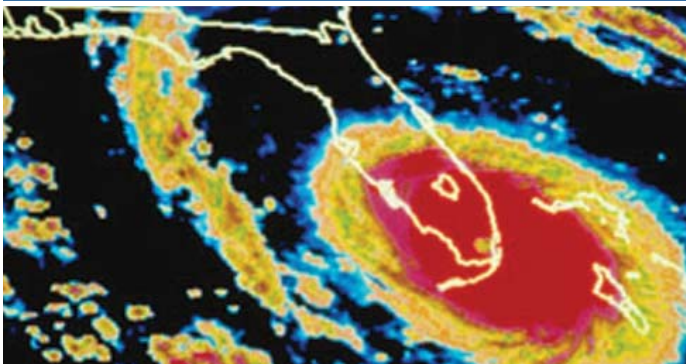


Are You Ready for Hurricane Season?

"SUNRISE SALUTES AMERICA" PARADE. On Wednesday, July 4, beginning at 10:00 a.m., the parade will wind its way along Sunset Strip from NW 12th Street to City Park (between NW 64th Avenue and NW 68th Avenue). CONCERT & FIREWORKS SPECTACULAR. Welleby Park (11100 NW 44th Street) will once again be the site of the City's FREE July 4 evening events. Rides and refreshments will be available. Live entertainment will include a performance by local band Breeze, followed by headliners and rock/pop icons ***THREE DOG NIGHT***. The band is entering its fourth decade of popularity, enjoying a chart-topping career that's included 21 consecutive Top 40 hits and 12 gold records. Three Dog Night is known for such crowd-pleasing singles as "Mama Told Me (Not to Come)," "Joy to the World," "Shambala," "One (is the Loneliest Number)," "An Old Fashioned Love Song," and "Black and White." Following the concert, at approximately 9:00 p.m., the City will light up the sky with an amazing fireworks display.
