Participating in the U.S. Census is our civic responsibility – and helps address critical needs in our community. Census information is used to:

- Draw federal, state, and local legislative districts
- Attract new businesses to state and local areas
- Forecast transportation needs for all segments of the population
- Plan for hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, and the location of other health services
- **Allocate over \$675 billion annually in federal funds and even more in state funds**
- Create maps to speed emergency services to households in need of assistance
- Provide genealogical research
- Plan for school projects and develop adult education programs
- Determine areas eligible for housing assistance and rehabilitation loans

Plastics do not biodegrade but rather slowly break down into smaller pieces of plastic (microplastics). **It can take hundreds of years for plastic products to decompose**, so the sooner we take action, the better.
