

## All Temporary and Relief Signage Must also Comply with Current Regulations, including:



All signs must be securely placed on private property and shall not be located within a site visibility triangle.



Maintain a minimum distance of 10 feet between signage and all rights-of-way – signage is not allowed in public rights-of-way.



All temporary and relief signage must be removed during an active tropical storm warning or hurricane watch or warning issued by the NOAA National Hurricane Center.



Property ownership permission is required.



Temporary and relief signage cannot be affixed/attached to landscaping, light poles, or other prohibited elements.



Snipes signs are not permitted.

*All other signage and attention attracting devices not specifically permitted by City Code or the Temporary Signage Relief is required to be removed. Noncompliance with such regulations, will cause a notice of violation from the City to both the property owner and individual business*

# BUSINESS SIGNAGE RELIEF!

## Business Reopening



The City of Sunrise Commission has provided temporary relief for business signage in non-residential zoning districts, which means that your business may have new options for exterior signage to attract customers during COVID-19! From May 15 to December 31, 2020, we have suspended enforcement for specific temporary signage to facilitate the re-opening of Sunrise businesses, and our Community Enhancement and Code Compliance team is available to help you explore what will work for your business and customers.

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# Temporary Relief from Current Code allows:

Effective until 12/31/2020

Each BUSINESS may have **ONE** of the following options:



One banner sign up to 40 square feet, which must be installed on the front of the building of the establishment.



OR



One flag sign up to 20 square feet.



Each SHOPPING CENTER may have:



One temporary directory sign up to 64 square feet.



All other signage and attention attracting devices not specifically permitted by City Code or the Temporary Signage Relief is required to be removed. Noncompliance with such regulations, will cause a notice of violation from the City to both the property owner and individual business.

# In addition, Current Code also allows:



One grand opening banner up to 40 square feet, not to exceed the business establishment's roof line of the building, which can be displayed for 45 days; *(Requires Permit)*



AND



One 4' tall by 2' wide sandwich sign, which can be displayed daily only during business hours (or three per parcel if single occupancy building). This must not be located within the right-of-way, and must maintain a 3' accessible sidewalk route;



AND



Special event signage for permitted, approved Special Events.

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
